A Memorial to Margaret Thompson by John Thompson.

Margaret was born in East Brent and was baptised in St Mary's Church. In time she became a member of the Church Choir and was invited to join the team of bell ringers which she enjoyed keenly. School started early for her. She decided at the age of three that she wanted to attend school since her playmates were there and duly presented herself. She was allowed to attend but for how long I am not sure. She later attended Sexey's Grammar School in Blackford gaining her School Certificate in seven subjects.

Margaret and I were married in St Mary's in 1962 and although my work took us away from the area, she always retained a close link with the village. One aspect was the annual Harvest Home function and I was reminded over the years of the ritual procession of ladies carrying puddings to the marquee as part of the lunch. More recently she became a keen supporter of the East Brent History Group.

Margaret was called in November last. With son and daughter, we have provided a bench seat in the churchyard and our thanks go to the Rev. Simon Lewis, Churchwardens and members who have made it happen. The seat is in a peaceful setting and it welcomes a moment to just sit and think.
