Amongst others, sections of the exhibition contained information on:


- St. Mary's Church and Rossholme,

#### Harvest Home 1857 to 1957

As many will know, the East Brent Harvest Home began in 1857 when the idea was suggested to St. Mary's vicar, Ven. Archdeacon George Denison by the Curate Mr. Griggs.

The Morning Post of Saturday 5th September 1857 reported:

"On Thursday the first annual harvest festival took place at East Brent, commencing with Divine service. The villagers and their friends, all dressed in their best, went to church where they devoutly joined in prayers, and listened to a sermon preached by Archdeacon Denison, from the 5th chapter of the general epistle of St. James, and the 13th verse.

Afterwards the male part of the rustic population sat down to a substantial dinner spread in a large tent, erected in the vicarage meadows. Festooned and decorated at every point, the interior of the canvas erected looked exceedingly pretty. 'Temperance in all things;' 'Old England for ever;' 'Long live the Vicar;' 'God save the Queen;' 'God bless the Prince of Wales;' 'Agriculture,' and similar mottoes met the eye at every point.

Not very much had changed 100 years later in 1957 except that all men and women could sit down together for the sumptuous lunch and tickets had to be paid for. A number of photographs have recently been made available to the Parish History Group by a long-time resident and a number are shown here. Anyone recognise the faces?
